Meningitis is a rare but serious inflammation of the lining that surrounds the brain and spinal cord. College freshman who live in residence halls have a modestly increased risk of meningococcal disease relative to other persons their age. The most common early signs are similar to the flu- high fever, severe headache, neck stiffness, nausea & vomiting, lethargy & rash. It is transmitted through close, direct contact with the oral secretions of an infected person, such as kissing, sharing drinks or utensils, or coughing. Students are urged to seek medical care immediately of the experience two or more of these symptoms concurrently. Meningtis Vaccines (i.e.Menactra or Menveo) is a relatively safe vaccine that can protect against four of the five most common strains of the bacteria that causes meningitis. Protective antibody levels are achieved 7-10 days after vaccine administration, and provides protection for about 5 years. The National Centers for Disease Control(CDC) and the American College Health Association (ACHA) recommend all college students receive the vaccine or booster on or after 16th birthday. Hepatitis B is a viral infection of the liver that can cause permanent liver damage, liver cancer and even death. It is transmitted directly through contact with blood & body fluids or indirectly through objects contaminated by blood or body fluids. Common modes of transmission include sexual contact, needle sharing, piercings or tattooing, or sharing of razors or toothbrushes.Signs & symptoms can include, yellowing of the eyes & skin, fever, abdominal, nausea, vomiting, and dark colored urine. The Hepatitis B Vaccine Series (3 injections given over 6 months) is a safe & effective measure to prevent Hepatitis B.
