ABOUT THE CAMP

Transylvania's Academic Camp will give you an opportunity to sample college life while gaining academic knowledge and learning how to improve your scores on standardized tests.

SCHEDULE

Camp begins Sunday night, June 18, and concludes at noon on Friday, June 23.

Morning and afternoon sessions will explore different academic areas through lectures given by Transylvania faculty and staff members. These will often be the same lectures you might receive as a Transylvania student. For example, you might hear about economics in the morning and religion in the afternoon.

Evening sessions will help prepare you for the ACT and SAT exams. You will receive two evenings of math preparation and two of verbal preparation. This type of class usually costs as much as Transy's entire Academic Camp.

INSTRUCTORS

Kenny Moorman, professor of computer science, and Mike LeVan, associate professor of mathematics, will serve as instructors. Transy students will supervise the computer labs and will live with the campers in the residence halls.

FACILITIES

During camp, you will live in Transylvania residence hall and eat three meals a day in the dining hall, beginning with breakfast on Monday. You can also use Transy's library, computer laboratory, and recreational facilities. Internet service will not be available in the dorm rooms.

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for this camp, you must have a grade average of at least a B, and be recommended by two individuals – one of them a teacher or counselor who verifies your grades and confirms that you are interested in and could benefit from the camp's program.

Students from the Appalachian region are supported by a grant. The cost to those students is the \$75 registration fee which must be returned with the completed application. Non-Appalachian region students will pay \$325 for the experience. Enrollment is limited to 35 students (25 from Appalachia, 10 others). The application deadline is May 1 and confirmations will be sent by May 15. Letters of recommendation deadline is May 1 as they are part of the selection process. If you are not selected for camp, your deposit will be refunded. Mail recommendation letters to: Academic Camp, Transylvania University, 300 North Broadway, Lexington, KY 40508.

OTHER CAMP INFORMATION

The camp is coeducational. Campers, their parents, and relatives agree to abide by the rules and regulations established for the health, safety, and welfare of the campers. The camp is not responsible for loss of personal property.
